FUNDS ADMINISTRATION

ARPA Fund Administration – The recommendation includes \$15 million in FY 2021-22 to support the administration of programs related to ARPA funding contained within this section. Funding will be utilized to assist agencies in operational support, software licensing, and potentially vendor and contractor support. The level of assistance needed will be based on the complexity of administering the program and the amount of auditing and accounting necessary to ensure federal compliance.
